My dear friends,

Cathy and I have just returned from York where, for the first time, both our families (Cathy's and mine) spent time celebrating her 'big six-oh'! A wonderful, relaxed occasion, in which all the young'ens (everyone under 40!) got on splendidly together. Don't ask – otherwise we'll bore you with the pictures!

Talking with a friend yesterday, the conversation got round to the joys of being a grandparent — enjoying the company of the little ones, but not being responsible for them... until something goes wrong, but that's another story.

That's for most of us, of course. But for some it's very different. Having been born in the late thirties, I had a father who was off fighting Mr. Hitler when I was growing up, and a mother who was engaged in 'war work'. This meant that Granny was my dad and mum. Sometimes I'd get to see my glamorous mum, and much less often a strange man with a scratchy uniform and guns and things would come and stay for a few days. That was dad.

In my own little way, I missed my father like anything. I used to make up little stories for myself about 'when dad comes home' – I never considered that he might not, of course.

And I got to wondering: was the 'inbetween' time – the time between Easter and Pentecost – a bit like that for the Apostles? The Man Whom they had followed, had loved, for three exciting years was gone, and yet not gone.

They had nothing much to do, and yet He had promised them that they would be the start of 'The Church' – whatever that might be.

Were they making plans? Or when Peter said "I'm going fishing!" was he thinking of making arrangements for an uncertain future?

Then came the Ascension. What did that mean? Had Jesus left them for ever? It certainly seemed like it; it must have felt pretty final.

More waiting.

Then, all together in Jerusalem, perhaps in that same upper room where they had celebrated Passover, they had it all come together. So that was it! Lives changed, power unlike any other they had experienced before, and theirs to use to the glory of God.

They were released from their uncertainty, and were burning to tell the story of their Risen Saviour.

And what of us? We've celebrated Easter; we look forward to Pentecost... again. Will we experience the 'mighty rushing wind', the light 'like tongues of flame'? Or will it just be another joyful celebration, after which we all go home and live our lives as before?

The Holy Spirit is waiting to take us on the next stage of our journey: are we willing to get on board?
